

## Just WING It!

With the launch of the Little Wing in its SoHo flagship, the Wing is now offering childcare & parenting support to members

f you're a #MillennialMom in New York City, chances are that you are familiar with the Wing. Founded two years ago by CEO Audrey Gelman (former deputy communications director for Scott Stringer's comptroller campaign) and COO Lauren Kassan (whose background is in business development in the fitness industry), the Wing is a chic network of membershipbased work and community spaces designed especially for women, with locations in the Flatiron District, SoHo, and DUMBO, as well as in San Francisco and Washington DC.

Set against soothing hues of millennial pink, goldenrod, and mint, the Wing offers a myriad of services aimed at empowering its membership of modern working women—for example: Fully stocked beauty rooms, conference rooms, breast pumping rooms,

a café with an all-female kitchen staff, a library of books by, for, and about inspiring women—and as of now, with the launch of the Little Wing in their SoHo flagship space on Mercer Street, that list of services includes childcare and parenting support.

"The big Wing is a network of womenfocused co-working and community spaces... We have all different types of programming and events, as well as a workspace," Kassan, who is a new mom herself (her son Quincy is 1) explains. "So many of our members have children or are thinking about having children, so it was really important to us to provide something to make their lives easier and create communities."

On the surface, the Little Wing is a childcare facility and service for members of the Wing with kids ages 6 months to 9 years—it will offer babysitting in two-hour time slots with the company's Wingsitters

(\$25); children's enrichment classes in art, theater, yoga, and more (\$28); and open play (\$25) sessions—but it goes beyond what the typical childcare drop-off or playspace provides. Most notably, the Little Wing will also offer support groups and workshops with an emphasis on creating connections and community among working moms. It's this commitment to serving the whole family that Kassan is especially proud of.

"I have a baby-he's 1-so when we were thinking of what the now-Little Wing would be, we weren't really sure how it would take shape and for us, [it was about] really learning from our members and what they want from a space like this," she says. "For me personally, going through the early times of motherhood, I really wanted to understand how we could create that space of convenience so our members can drop their kids off here, get work done, take their

meeting, and have some quiet time—but also [create a space] of community for our members."

The parent support groups and workshops will be updated monthly, and will be offered in partnership with Gelman's mother Lisa Spiegel, the co-founder of SoHo Parenting (founded in 1987 and widely considered to be the first parenting center in Manhattan). There is a regular open mother's group (to take place in the mornings) as well as topic-based workshops (which will take place in the evenings to accommodate parents who work a more traditional schedule).

"[Lisa Spiegel] is going to be overseeing a lot of our workshops and support circles based on varying topics—everything from potty-training to co-parenting to queer parenting—and making sure they're incredibly thoughtful and intentional for a diverse group of parents," Kassan says.

The goals of intentional community building are echoed by Spiegel as well. "It's sort of a 'circle of life' kind of thing because [my daughter] Audrey was an infant when I was starting my business, and it grew over the past 30 years to provide high quality counseling and support services and community to parents and families," she explains. "So it was so exciting to be a part of the launch of the Little Wing and help the Wing not just support mothers who are working by providing childcare—which is essential and amazing, to be able to work and know your child is close by and feel comfortable with the quality of the care—but also to provide ways to support families in similar ways to how we've been supporting families at SoHo Parenting for over 30 years."

One of the ways that Kassan and Spiegel hope to foster support with their programming for parents is to help the mothers of the Wing cast off the pressures of perfection that can come across in social media and the societal stereotype of what a working parent should look like.

"The focus of the ongoing mother's group [at the Little Wing] is really to be a safe space to talk about the realities of motherhood rather than the curated Instagram version of motherhood that really is, in essence, a tyranny," Spiegel says. "There has always been pressure on women to be perfect and to do everything and to present that 'I've got it together' face, but it's never been there as much as it is now. So the idea [is to have] a space that combats the physical isolation that sometimes women have in parenting, but also that sense of sort of cyber-loneliness.

The idea that there's all this information and expectations that are just bombarding women? This is the antidote to that."


The Little Wing space itself is physically very bright and inviting, and certainly an antidote, in and of itself, to the bustle of the city streets outside. The color scheme echoes that of the big Wing and all the furnishings are from Crate&kids. There's a big playroom stocked with plush beanbags and toys aimed at sparking imaginative play, as well as a library of kids' books curated by Brooklyn bookshop Stories. Plus, there's on-brand mommy-and-me merch for sale, and a café called Perch on the Fly (the big Wing's café is called Perch) in the works that will sell quick snacks and meals.

"Perch on the Fly will be our graband-go. There will be kids' bowls and

kids' meals," Kassan says. "They were all crowdsourced from our members and we learned what their kids liked to eat and made recipes based on that, and they're named after [members' kids]. There's a Quincy bowl for my son-which is spinach, quinoa, and chicken."

As far as future goals for the growth of the Little Wing? Kassan is certainly thinking big: "We want Little Wings all over the country and the world," she says. "As we grow our big Wing, the hope and the goal is that we can open Little Wings everywhere so we can continue to provide this sense of community for our members everywhere."

Chef in the City

Noted NYC chef & foodie Eden Grinshpan dishes on motherhood, her downtown restaurant DEZ. and her passion for travel

hether she's going viral for doing the robot while strapped to a breast pump or sharing photos of her and her almost-2-year-old daughter Ayv, chef, food blogger, and TV personality (you can catch her North of the border on "Top Chef Canada") Eden Grinshpan is definitely not one to keep up glossy appearances of motherhood. It's clear from her unabashedly silly posts that she has found a happy medium between herself as a person and as a mom.

Food is understandably a very big factor in their household. As a certified fabulous foodie herself, Grinshpan, a Brooklyn mama, was excited to start introducing solid foods to her daughter's diet so they could bond over bites. Though she tries to widen Ayv's palette as much as she can, it's not always easy. "The older she gets, the more she knows, the pickier she gets," Grinshpan says. "It's been a little bit of a battle."

With all of the healthy food options available to families now, like Grinshpan's recently opened restaurant DEZ (where she is the co-owner and executive chef) it's especially easy to get hung up on strict vegetable-based diets. So, how does one balance her little one's meals? Moderation is

"[My daughter] likes sugar, she likes sweet things. She gets a lot of fruit, she loves fruit... But, you know, she gets a little junk," Grinshpan says. "I had to let go a little bit because I was a little controlling over everything being healthy, but I'm very much a believer of trying to keep it 75-80 percent healthy, and the rest you can kind of be easy."

Grinshpan's love for cooking first began when she started watching the Food Network as a sophomore in high school. She recalls being "obsessed" with Food Network stars Ina Garten, Nigella Watson, and Jamie Oliver. When it came time to decide where she should go to college, culinary school was



"the only thing that really made sense." Thus began the start of her culinary career, or what she likes to call her "love affair with food and cooking."

She enrolled in Le Cordon Bleu in London where she graduated with a grande diplome in pastry and cuisine. Rather than looking for work, Grinshpan, whose heritage is Canadian and Israeli, sought to see the world.

"A lot of people are afraid of being uncomfortable or not close to what they know, but honestly I've never grown more than when I was away. I really, truly believe my time abroad was my education," she says. Grinshpan then went on to backpack through India and Southeast Asia, and lived in London for two years.

Even at the time of our interview, they had just returned from a family trip to Israel. How have their travels changed now that Ayv's joined the family? Parents are often afraid of taking long flights with their children, but Grinshpan feels the benefits outweigh the cons.

"For me, it's kind of like ripping off a

Band-Aid. You do it, you get it over with, and you get to have an experience," she explains. "To be able to take Ayv to Israel and to eat the food that I grew up eating, and to see the places, that mean so much to me."

These travels, as well as Grinsphan's own Israeli roots, are what inspired her the vibe for her restaurant, DEZ (short for "desert"), a fast-casual Middle Eastern eatery located

in the heart of Nolita. Co-founded with Samantha Wasser, (who is known in the food world for the NYC vegan restaurant by CHLOE) DEZ's fresh and tasty meals are ideal for everyday dining with a twist.

As we caught up over the phone, there was a small cry in the background. Grinshpan laughs. "She's here," she says, referencing her young daughter. "She was supposed to go down an hour ago, but guess what? She's watching 'Peppa Pig!""

Whether she's sharing candid photos of her breastfeeding in the back of a car (#NormalizeBreastFeeding), or her hilarious take on the traditional maternity shoot (a tower of gourmet doughnuts were involved), Grinshpan is definitely honest about the realities of being a parent.

"Yeah, [my husband and I] get flustered sometimes, but in the end, we just laugh about it because it's just so ridiculous," she says. "The things we get flustered about in the grand scheme of things, they're nothing."

## **Back to Basics**

Dr. Tanya Altmann's latest book speaks to 150 of new parents' top concerns

eing a parent isn't an easy job. Whether it's your first time or you have multiple children, each experience feels new and raises a brand new set of questions. Ever wondered what to do if your child is allergic to regular milk, or when to start looking for child care, if you choose to do so? Dr. Tanya Altmann has all of the answers.


In her latest book, Baby & Toddler Basics: Expert Answers to Parents' Top 150 Questions, Altmann-alongside the American Academy of Pediatrics-narrowed down a list of the top 150 questions they have been asked multiple times by parents and patients, which she says was no easy feat.

"I've been seeing patients and talking to parents for about 20 years and there are hundreds if not thousands of questions that parents ask, but over and over again, the same questions seem to keep popping up. As a pediatrician... you end up repeating yourself a lot throughout the day," Altmann says. "I surveyed pediatricians and parents [and] I also talked to all of the pediatricians at UCLA, and came up with a list that we all agreed were the top 150 questions that parents ask their pediatrician."

Narrowing down the questions into specific categories, such as skin, vaccines, formula feeding, and more, Altmann made it easier than ever for parents to get their concerns answered since a lot of the time, the types of questions parents ask typically fall under a general category-whether they know it or not.

"I find that questions do come in groups," Altmann says. "I teach residents at UCLA and one day, we'll talk about fevers in kids or illnesses and the next day, it'll be about constipation or poop, and then it'll be about feeding."

Rather than having to read chapters on specific topics, Altmann's question and answer format allows parents to quickly find what



they are looking for so they don't have to read five or more pages to get their answer.


"I always love the Q&A format because you can look in the index, look at the chapter, find your question, and read the answer," Altmann says. "That's what pediatricians do all day long: Answer questions, field phone calls, and nowadays, there [are] emails as well, so the Q&A format is always a nice setting to read no matter what the topic is."

Altmann believes that what sets her book apart from all the other baby books out there is that the answers given are backed by science with the additional help of her own personal experience as a mother to her three boys: Avrick, 12, Collen, 10, and Maxton, 3.

"When I look back at books I've written and news segments I've done before I had kids, I think 'What was I talking about?' because although I knew the medicine, I didn't really know the practicality of it," Altmann says. "For instance, I used to say 'If your child slips and falls and gets a goose egg on their head, put ice on it.' But now, as a parent, I know that child is not going to let you put ice on their head, so I have to say 'If they'll let you."

As a pediatrician and mother herself, Altmann knows that when a problem arises with a child, it can be stressful, but if she could give one piece of advice, it would be to "trust your instincts."

"People have been having babies forever, before the internet, before swaddle blankets



At the end of the day, Altmann hopes that the advice she provides helps parents determine whether they need to go to their pediatrician or if they can solve the issue on their own, as long as they steer clear of "Dr. Google."

"I hope that parents enjoy it as an easy and accurate source to look up questions that they have so they don't turn to Dr. Google," Altmann says. "While it's amazing that there's so much information at your fingertips, there's also a lot of fake news out there. You want to make sure that people have an accurate source, but also know when to call their pediatrician. I hope by breaking it down to the simple categories, they can realize that if the answer isn't there, then they can gather information to get what they need or find out these are one of the times where 'I do need to take my baby in to be seen or call my pediatrician."

## Why Consider Charter **Schools?**

t is prime school-search season in New York City. If you are one of thousands of families weighing their child's educational options for pre-Kindergarten, elementary, middle, and high school, you are in the thick of applications, essays, and assessments or testing. Aside from your normal work and daily activities during this time, you now must add researching schools, contacting administrators, and touring neighborhood options to your busy to-do list. This is true whether you considering public or private schools.

So, how does one choose the best option? Begin with the big decision—public or private. Then, take a look at the options within your preferred category.

For those utilizing the City's public school options, you have many options in your district, with priority at your zoned school, and you will also have access to a host of charter schools.

Charter schools (founded by not-forprofit Boards of Trustees) receive government funding, but unlike public schools, they operate independently under a contract (or "charter")—an example of what has been labeled by some as "public asset privatization" or contracting out. Many of the city's charter schools utilize public school space. Since the passing of the New York Charter Schools Act of 1998, there has been debate from government officials and families alike on whether these schools should be considered public. According to the United States Department of Education, given that charter schools are open to all students and do not charge tuition, they are categorized right alongside your area public schools.

"We serve the communities in which we are located, and in 2019-2020, we will offer kindergarten through second grade," says Emily Kim, the Chief Executive Officer of



Zeta Charter Schools, which has sites in the South Bronx and the Inwood/Washington Heights areas. Zeta opened its doors in the fall of 2018.

Charter schools may not have all the regulations of a districted school, but they are accountable for academic results and upholding promises that the charter school stemmed from. With well over 200 charter schools in the city, there are tens of thousands of New York City families that are served by these institutions, and these schools have thousands more on their waitlists.

So, why are so many families choosing charter schools? Charter schools have more flexibility in their offerings, a longer school year, extended daily hours, and additional

programming.

"Much of my experience is in charter education, and I love how charters are free to innovate and raise the excellence bar for children," Kim says.

Although every charter is different (the model, goals and policies may vary) — overall, they are outperforming their neighborhood counterparts on state tests (English language arts and math).

"Parents deserve to have a high-quality school option, as well as a choice as to where they send their children to school. Charters provide parents with much-needed educational options for their children, which raises the bar for public education generally," Kim says. "We serve families, and want them to be close partners with us in their children's education. Through this partnership, we ensure children meet their highest and best potential."

Many families are drawn by the opportunity to send their children to highperforming charter schools. Most operate through a lottery placement system due to the demand.


"We were zoned for a failing public school (math and reading scores were in the single-digit percentile) and private school is too costly," says Tiffany G., who is a parent at Harlem Hebrew Language Academy Charter School. Her daughter, now in fourth grade, started at the school in kindergarten.

"Public schools in New York are wonderful, if you are wealthy and thereby able to afford an affluent neighborhood where high-quality public schools can be found. For many who are not wealthy or able to afford expensive neighborhoods, public schools are poor performing, sometimes perilous places. The current public school system exacerbates our city's economic system of have and have-nots, while many charter schools offer a high-quality of education accessible to all New Yorkers regardless of income," she says. Adding: "There is a tremendous amount of variety

among charter schools, as they are not bound by all the same regulations as public schools. Shop around to find the school that is the best fit for your child's learning needs."

For families in the midst of the school search, an online common application (available via nyccharterschools.org) represents approximately 75 percent of New York City's charter schools adding ease to the process of applying. The online form, due by April 1, makes searching school options and information on each accessible. New York families interested in applying to charter schools should check individual school websites for listings of tours, open houses, and application instructions.

The View Co-Host Sunny Hostin gets personal about work, family & living the good life in Westchester (complete with beehives & a chicken coop)

he first thing you notice about "The View" Sunny Hostin is that she really lives up to her name. When she and I met in her dressing room (complete with chic framed photos, a plush sofa, and an uber-organized makeup vanity) at the ABC studios near Columbus Circle, the temperatures were clocking in at a high of 14 degrees F and a low of 4 degrees F—and yet, she warmed the day right up with her bright smile and cheery demeanor.

To be fair, Hostin has plenty in her life to smile about right now. She lives the best of both city life (at work in Manhattan) and suburban life (at home in Westchester, where she loves to garden and tend to her bee hives and chicken coop). She's killing it as part of the tight-knit "sorority" of diverse co-hosts on "The View" (alongside Whoopi Goldberg, Joy Behar, Meghan McCain, and Abby Huntsman) and as the Senior Legal Correspondent (for which she's an Emmy-winner) for ABC News. She co-owns a restaurant in New Rochelle called Alvin & Friends that counts Supreme

Court Justice Sonia Sotomayor as a regular. And, most importantly in her eyes, she's enjoying a thriving relationship with her teenage son, Gabriel, and tween daughter, Paloma.

"My son is 16 and my daughter is 12...and I have loved every single stage of being a mom, and I feel like it gets better and better," she gushes. "Everyone told me that it gets harder... But I just feel like it's not that it gets harder, it just changes. It's an important job, being a mom, and I've loved every single minute of it."

Hostin, 50, also truly loves the work she does. A lawyer who long harbored dreams of being on television, Hostin came to "The View" via a career path paved first with a law degree and her natural gift for public speaking, and stints at Court TV, Fox News, and CNN.

"[Growing up], I definitely wanted to be a journalist and I wanted to tell other people's stories. But at the time, and this was pre-Oprah, my mother was horrified at the thought of her kid who was smart and who she had invested so much in saying: 'I want to do television!' She was like: 'No one looks like you on television! What are you talking about?' She really didn't get it, that I wanted to tell other people's stories," Hostin recalls, adding that though her father encouraged her dreams, her mother advised her to pursue law school. "I loved law school and it was such a great fit for me, but in the back of mind I kept thinking: 'I really should be doing something else."

After studying journalism undergrad at SUNY Binghamton and then going to law school at Notre Dame, Hostin went on to work as a trial attorney for the Justice Department and federal prosecutor before deciding to give the stay-at-home-mom life a try after giving birth to her son. "After I had my son, I thought I was going to be a stayat-home mom, but that wasn't a great fit because I was driving everyone crazy," she says. "I decided I was going to



be the best stay-at-home mom ever! I was making my own food for Gabriel and I was the best dog owner and the best gardener and it was just too much."

During this time, Hostin attended a law conference where she was called upon to speak in public afterwards, she was approached by Sabrina Thompson, a producer for Court TV, who complimented her on her speaking prowess. Two weeks later, Hostin was on-air on Court TV; about six months after that, she was making appearances on "Nancy Grace" and Fox News; and another short six months later, she was a regular on CNN as a host and legal analyst. Eventually, she came to ABC as an overnight anchor for ABC News, and began guest-hosting on "The View" in 2012, where she has now been an official co-host since 2016.

During a moment of calm between taping an episode of "The View," and rushing back to Westchester to gather snacks for her daughter's basketball game that day ("I'm the 7th grade basketball parent...I'm the one who brings the snacks"), I caught up with Hostin about balancing city and country, work and family, and her personal passions and hobbies ("You know who I got into bees? Whoopi Goldberg! She's becoming a beekeeper this spring!").

#### Your kids are 16 and 12—how has the adjustment been as a mom as your kids get older?

It is going really well. I hear all these horror stories from other parents—like: "Oh! You're going to hate the teenage years!" But I haven't really had that. Certainly, they're growing and trying new things—actually, my son just got his learners' permit for driving last weekend, and of course, my friends said it was going to be horrible, but it was kind of cool! He's like: "Can I drive home from the post office?" and I was like: "Sure!" He was driving kind of fast—I had to say: "Hey, wait a minute!"—he's got kind of lead foot and the speed limit is 35 on our street. But I just liked seeing the independence.

#### What does your family like to do together?

Both of my kids are athletes and my daughter plays 7th grade volleyball, basketball, and track and field, and



my son just decided to stop swimming—he'd been swimming since he was like 2—and now concentrates just on football and track and field. I spend a lot of time going to the games. I have a game today for my daughter and we spent Saturday at the New Balance indoor track meet. We are also looking at colleges for my son-I can't believe he's graduating in 2020! We're a very active family, so we do a lot of outdoor things. Yesterday it was about making sure my chickens were warm enough because it was like 1 degree out when we woke up!

#### I love that you keep chickens at home-but I was wondering: How do you keep them warm in the winter?

We added extra hay, we made sure that all the windows in the coop were closed, and the kids helped me. We actually bought some heating pads for the chickens and we bought a heated roost bar and we also put Vaseline on their waddles so that they didn't get frostbite. It sounds crazy, but...we put this blue ointment [on one of them]—we have one Bantam chicken and we were a little worried about her because she's smaller than the others, and she doesn't want to huddle with them, so we wanted to make sure she was the warmest one.

#### I'm eager to hear about your bees as well!

I'm fascinated by bees because they're prehistoric and they've been around forever. People have used honey as a salve, it's used to fight infection, and it's one of

our ancient ointments. My grandmother from Puerto Rico used to use it when I would get scrapes. She said it would protect the skin from scars. I always thought that everyone did that but I guess they don't? So it has been something that I was always interested in... I've read a lot about how bees are becoming extinct, and we really have to think about that. If bees become extinct, where's our food coming from? It'll be catastrophic!

#### It's so great that you've spoken about your passion for bees quite a bit on "The View."

I found this company Best Bees and they installed the bee hives [at my house]... I befriended the owner of the company—his name is Noah—and he is the most interesting guy ever. He comes to our house and what was supposed to be a 30 minute meeting became a three hour lesson on bees and beekeeping and honey... He taught me how to harvest honey and he taught my daughter how to make candles from the bees' wax. We are out of control! Of course, I brought him to the show because I made honey and beekeeping some of my Favorite Things for Christmas. He works with NASA and Whole Foods—he's a bee whisperer. I introduced him to [my co-host] Whoopi Goldberg, and now he's been at Whoopi's house. But Whoopi's getting two bee hives so now I have to get another hive because I can't be out-bee'd by people! I have to be the top beekeeper!

You have your bees, chickens, and family all

#### out in Westchester, but you grew up in the Bronx, and you work in Manhattan. Did you always see yourself moving to the suburbs?

I always wanted to have a house. I would watch movies and we'd go to Puerto Rico and see houses. I do love the city life, and I don't think I could live in a place where I couldn't get to a city within an hour or a half an hour because I love the energy. I remember when I went to law school and undergrad, really, I felt like I missed the pace and the energy. So I've always lived within traveling distance to a city, but I did want this kind of life.

#### Do you have any tips for parents thinking about making the move to the suburbs?

To be sure, it's not the easiest transition, because there's the travel time, especially if you work in the city—I have to build in at least an hour every day. The restaurants close early and it's not like the city that never sleeps. You don't have the same amenities, for sure, but there really is something special about, when you leave the city...I remember seeing the snow fall and actually seeing the glistening of the snow while walking my dog. I love it.

#### Switching gears a bit-let's talk about your work. What has your experience been like on "The View"? What do you enjoy about it?

What I like most about it is that it's such an incredible, incredible platform. It's a legacy show—there aren't that many shows that have been on for over 20 years, and have this mix of pop culture, current events,

politics, and you have five women who are from different backgrounds, and we're talking about the stuff that everyone is talking about. A lot of people have tried to duplicate or replicate what we do, but they don't do it as well and I'm not sure why. I think that it's probably multi-factorial, but it's because we just know how to do this, and it's just the legacy of it all. I love being part of that—it's like a sorority that has only 22 members.

#### What are some of the challenges of the job?

I love being able to reach people where it matters for them and be a voice for the community—it's wonderful and it's a real privilege—but with that comes a tremendous responsibility and that can be very hard sometimes. Because, one, you completely lose your anonymity in a way that I don't know that I expected. I was on CNN for many, many years...but then all of a sudden I'm on "The View" and 3 million people watch this show. So you get on the train as a native New Yorker and people are staring at you... It's very different for someone like me, a kid from the Bronx.

#### What's the dynamic like with your co-hosts?

I think the mix is good because we all understand that this is different and unique and we protect each other. And we're lead by someone who has been on the show forever, Joy Behar—we listen to her, she's been through it all, she's seen it all. Whoopi moderates—and she's also been through it all and seen it all. So we have a very good support system and that's extremely helpful. I think, without that, it would be extremely difficult. We also leave our disagreements at the table and, really, if we had people who didn't understand that, it would be impossible, because we tackle really tough, tough issues.

#### Between work, motherhood, and your personal passions, what does the work-life balance equation look like for you?


I really put my family first. It's more important to me than anything else... There are certain things that will fall by the wayside but I will have the snacks for my daughter's game today. I prioritize what's important to me. I have everything on my Google calendareverything! I print it out, usually on Sunday night so I know what my day and my week and my month all look like. I make sure that my kids' stuff is prioritized and my family's stuff is prioritized. To be sure, some things fall by the wayside, unfortunately. I'm sure it has happened to every working mom, and stay-athome mom...it just happened to me recently: My son is taking this SAT prep course and I could have sworn it started at 1:30pm last week, but it was at 1pm. We showed up at 1:30pm and he missed half an hour. But hey, he was there and he'll live.







# Family Living: Town & Country

### Expert insights for considering the key city vs. suburbs question

ew York City is a fabulous place to raise a family—however, as your family grows, the question of where to make your home grows to even greater importance. The answer to the city vs. suburbs question is different for every family—so we spoke with top brokers working in Manhattan and some of the most desirable neighborhoods surrounding the city to get their take on what's on offer for parents in both NYC and the suburbs right now.

#### **MANHATTAN**

There's nothing quite like living in the greatest city in the world. We're surrounded by endless cultural offerings with every conceivable culinary choice at our doorstep and conveniences that can't be beat.

And when it comes to housing, Manhattan also offers a full spectrum of options...whether an apartment, townhouse, loft or a high rise tower with commanding views. For many city slickers there does come a point when they start to think about life beyond Manhattan—a more serene environment, more space, greener pastures and, more times than not, affordability.

However, in the past decade Manhattan is winning out over the suburbs as the destination of choice. More new construction condos have been built with large apartments, boasting three, four, or even five bedrooms that are chock full of wonderful amenities like playrooms, basketball courts, billiard/ recreation rooms, party rooms, swimming pools, etc. to cater to this growing market. It's also commonplace for Manhattanites to live in apartments that have been combined to accommodate the space they need.

Generally speaking, Manhattanites live in less space than their suburban counterparts and they pay more for it. With the average price of an apartment in Manhattan hovering in the \$2 million range, large apartments here come with a premium price tag. During the Fourth Quarter 2018, \$1,404,117 was the average price for a two-bedroom co-op (\$2,274,385 for a condo) and three-bedroom and larger co-ops averaged \$3,159,741 (\$8,225,107 for condos). I have come across opportunities, south of 96th Street, where a

two-bedroom is trading for under \$700,000 or a three-bedroom apartment can be had for under \$1.5 million. However, those properties generally come with "issues" such as no view, no doorman, high maintenance, etc. Those looking for value on this island tend to look north of 96th Street, whether it's Hamilton Heights, Central Harlem (with an influx of more affordable new condo developments in the past 10 years), Washington Heights, or Inwood, where your dollar goes a lot further. -Andrew Kramer, Brown Harris Stevens, (212) 317-3634, ajkramer@bhsusa.com

#### RIVERDALE, THE BRONX

An easy MetroCard swipe (and only two subway stops North) of Manhattan, Riverdale is a bucolic enclave of the Bronx that is nestled alongside the Hudson River to the East, Van Cortlandt Park to the west (with 1,146 acres, it's actually larger than Central Park) and Westchester to the North. Rolling hills and lush green space characterize the areas landscape with a diverse housing stock to choose from.

Manhattanites can trade their Classic Six or three-bedroom co-ops (or twobedroom condos) apartments for a beautiful landmarked or contemporary estate in Fieldston or the Estate Area. Lovely smaller single-family homes in South and North Riverdale, with diverse architectural styles and wonderfully low New York City taxes, are comparable in price to a Manhattan one- or two-bedroom.

And when it comes to apartment living, there's a multitude of building styles and sizes, ranging from prewar to mid-century/postwar cooperatives to sleek new condominiums (many with Hudson River views) for a fraction of their Manhattan equivalents. At the high-end of the market, new construction condominiums are trading in the \$700 per square-ft. range (translating to under \$1.5 million for a 2,000-square-ft. three-bedroom) and spacious prewar and postwar co-ops (many with doorman) three-bedrooms begin in the \$500,000 range with two-bedroom co-ops starting in the mid \$300,000 and up (1,000-square-ft. newer construction condos in the \$600,000 range) with Junior 4s and onebedrooms co-ops in the \$200,000 range with studios going for a song.

This vibrant community, spanning less than five miles, top to bottom, with a population of approximately 40,000, is home to a plethora of parks and cultural venues, houses of worship, shops, and restaurants, and is served by Fresh Direct. Riverdale is an ideal choice for those looking for big city convenience in a more suburban setting. -Andrew Kramer

#### **WESTCHESTER**

Thinking about moving out of the city to Westchester? The nearby county is great families. Westchester has a lot to offer besides affordability. You get more interior and exterior space compared to many other areas. If you are one who likes to entertain, you can find a home that has a deck large enough to fit a table and chairs, BBQ, and a backyard.

Throughout Westchester there are many activities such as indoor ice skating facilities, indoor and outdoor tennis centers/courts, horse trails, golf courses, mini golf, and town pools. In the winter you can be an easy car ride away to fabulous skiing. In the fall you can find many apple and pumpkin orchards. Many local parks have organized sports that offer baseball, soccer, lacrosse, and more.

If you are looking for the urban to suburban feel, you can find many communities that offer homes within walking distance to Metro North. Depending on where you live in Southern Westchester, your commute could be a 30-minute express train into Grand Central Station. You also have options to walk to restaurants or local stores around town. The Westchester, an indoor shopping mall, located in White Plains, offers shoppers a variety of stores. You may feel you are shopping on Madison Avenue without weaving through car traffic or tourists.

If you are looking to move to bucolic New Rochelle, you may be able to find a beautiful four-bedroom home for under \$1 million. In parts of White Plains, your taxes may be lower for a four-bedroom because of all the corporations in the area. In fact, many people both live and work in White Plains. Don't be deceived that it is another state. Lower Fairfield County, which includes Greenwich, Stamford, Darien, New Canaan, and more, is closer to NYC than many areas in Westchester and Long Island, with much lower property taxes. Many families are searching for a more down to earth environment to raise kids and a more relaxing environment to come home to after a hard day's work. Commuting is easy with trains to Grand Central and there are many opportunities in the Stamford/ Greenwich area as well.

There are options for apartments, townhouses, and single family homes, large and small, and the dollar certainly goes further than many of the other suburbs. The more affordable Stamford and Norwalk towns offer apartments/condos in the \$200,000-650,000 range and homes from \$400,000 to \$1 million and up. # **Destination: Santa Fe**

New Mexico offers families adventure by way of art, history & the outdoors

re you looking for a vacation that has lots of outdoor activities, delicious regional food, and sunny skies year-found, plus history, culture and more fascinating museums than you can possibly visit? Then think about heading to Santa Fe, New Mexico. There's no way can kids be bored in Santa Fe. It's a lively, flavorful, fun place, whether you're eating spicy chilis, buying handmade souvenirs from local artisans in the outdoor markets, hiking mountains, or admiring the nightly spectacle of the incredible sunsets.

**Art is everywhere:** Even if your kids aren't big museum-goers, give some of the ones here a shot; there are dozens to choose from. The Museum of International Folk **Art** is a toybox of treats with its incredibly detailed dioramas, dollhouses and puppets. Steps away is the Museum of Indian Arts & Culture where you can walk through ancient pueblo recreations and listen to the songs and stories that tell the origins and history of the Native people of the Southwest.

Even the colorful Georgia O'Keefe Museum is fun for older kids who can appreciate her landscapes and flowers, mountains, and even cityscapes. Want to see what local artists are up to? Take a stroll down Canyon Road and pop in and out of the hundreds of galleries there. Most have outdoor sculpture gardens, perfect for fun selfie shots your kids will love.

And if that isn't enough, Santa Fe is also home to a bug museum, plus a children's


museum, featuring indoor and outdoor hands-on exhibits, climbing wall, giant train set and drop-in art classes.

Out-of-sight adventure: For a truly magical experience for even the most jaded kid, head to Meow Wolf, an immersive art installation that words cannot describe. It's kind of like Oz meets Narnia on steroids. Explore the neon forest, room after room of hidden doorways that open up to secret worlds; climb a treehouse, enter a secret portal through the refrigerator, play musical dinosaur bones and get lost in a chaotic wonderland. There's even a children's activity area where kids can channel all the creativity they've seen and create their own installation.

**Spa-ing:** If mom and dad get some time off, head a few miles out of town to Ten Thousand Waves. At this serene Japanesestyled bathhouse nestled in the woods at the base of the Sangre de Cristo mountains, you can get an oxygen facial, herbal wrap, or foot massage, soak in one of many hot tubs and lounge around in the fresh mountain air in a kimono while sipping your choice of teas from a huge menu of options. Or right in







town, hit the Spa Sage, the full-service spa at La Posada resort, and treat yourself to a couple of hours of escape.

Outdoor Santa Fe: For the skiers, Ski **Santa Fe** is only minutes from downtown. There's also horseback riding, golfing, fishing, and tons of hiking nearby with great scenic vistas.

If you don't want too much activity, Santa Fe is a great town for walking. Peruse the stalls along the plaza where local Native Americans sell their hand-sculpted animals, silver jewelry and painting, or find fun alleyways where there are hidden fountains, flora, and stores with beautiful clothing and knick-knacks. You can always take a local jeep tour into the dessert for some off-road adventures. Or take a walking tour—there are those that focus on native cuisine, ghosts, architecture and chocolate.

Food: Chocolate. Need I say more. Santa Fe is a chocolate-lovers haven. You can sign up for a chocolate-tasting tour or visit a few spots on your own. Head to one of the two locations of Kakawa Chocolate House

where you'll find numerous hot chocolate elixirs on tap. Based on recipes recreated from historical sources, you can try pre-Columbian to Colonial American creations in beautiful hand-painted mugs from Oaxaca, Mexico. Want something spicy? Try the Chili Elixir. Sample a few before choosing...it's going to be a tough choice. Pair the liquid deliciousness with their innovative truffle flavors (goat cheese sage or cherry chili) that will have your mouth watering.

With all your activity, you're going to need lots of sustenance. Santa Fe is a foodlovers dream with dozens of world-class restaurants. Taste authentic native cuisine like the huge breakfast burritos at Tia Sophias and for the sophisticated palate, a modern take on old world cuisine at Sazon (where you can have a baby grasshopper tortilla – maybe better for an adults-night out!). For the adventurous, be sure to try the local red and green chilis offered with most meals; or be brave and ask for "Christmas" any time of the year and you'll get both.

Beware (especially with kids); if they say the peppers are "hot;" they truly are! The

spicy hot fudge sundae at The Shed seemed like a treat, but it was more than most could handle, even with the vanilla ice cream on top to cool the palette.

Stay: Staying at the historic La Fonda on the Plaza is like being in a fun, yet classy and comfortable museum. There is art on every wall and in every corner. Every headboard is hand-painted by a local artist as are some of the shower tiles. Even the glass covering the fire extinguishers is decorated as are all the gorgeous windows surrounding La Plazuela, the restaurant in the hotel's central courtyard. It's a blast of old-world Santa Fe elegance, with modern amenities, a pool and fitness room and a rooftop lounge with amazing sunset views.

Be sure to take the free tour to learn about the hotel's role in the city's history; it's part scavenger hunt, part history lesson. Young ones also get a drawstring backpack upon check-in, filled with goodies including a flashlight to do their own exploring.

# **COUNTING DOWN TO**

t may be cold outside and camp may be far from your mind, but if you are considering camp for this summer—or even 2019—there are ways to research and plan for camp throughout the year. The American Camp Association, New York and New Jersey, suggests the following month-by-month camp planner with ways to plan for your child's summer camp experience.

#### For Summer 2019 FEBRUARY/MARCH

Home Visits and Camp Fairs: These are both good ways to get to know a camp director and about a camp program. Ask about the camp's mission statement and what type of child is successful at camp. #### **APRIL/MAY**

Spring Festivals/Open Houses: Many camps host spring festivals and open houses at camp which is another great opportunity to visit the camp and talk to the camp leadership if you haven't made a camp decision yet. If you've decided on a camp already, attending the spring festival is a good way for your child to see the camp again and get acquainted with it before camp begins.

Share Positive Messages: As camp approaches, talk to your child about the camp program and the activities he or she will be participating in. Parents should let their child know that they are confident in the child's ability in having a suc- cessful camp



experience. It's also a great time to re-watch the camp video to get your child excited for the amazing summer ahead.

**Touring:** If you are considering camp for 2019, this is a good time to schedule a tour for July or August. Touring during the summer gives families a chance to see camp in action with campers enjoying all the fun activities. A tour also gives you a chance to ask the camp leadership questions while you are in the camp environment.

#### **JUNE**

Pack Together: If your child is going to overnight camp, pack together. Your child will feel more secure if they know what they are bringing to camp and you can use the time packing together to talk with your child about how much fun camp is going to be.

Mail a Letter to Camp: Send a letter to sleepaway camp so your child has a letter the first day they are at camp. Let them know how much fun they are going to have at camp.

Fall Festivals/Open Houses: Many camps have open houses and fall festivals that offer families a chance to see the camp facilities and get a feel for the camp. It is also a good opportunity for families to get to know the camp director and

ask questions about the camp philosophy and pro- gram while in the camp setting.

Parents and campers should take time to look over a camp's website, social media profiles, and videos. They will give families a sense of what a particular camp is like. Most camp websites have camp photos, videos, virtual tours, and maps which will give parents and children a glimpse of the camp and the camp program. The more involved a child feels in the decision of choosing a camp, the more successful the camp experience will be.

Look For Camp Early For Savings: Families who have already decided on a camp for their child shouldn't wait to register. Many camps offer early bird specials. Registering early can be a real savings for parents and also ensures that your child won't be shut out of the camp program he or she wants. Ask the camp if they offer payment plans which can make it easier for parents to pay for camp over the year. Some camps also allow you to prepay the camp season and will give you a significant discount. Need Assistance? Renee Flax at the American Camp Association, NY and NJ, is available year round to offer free, one-on-one advice in helping you find the right camp for your child. Renee will talk to you about your child, what you are look- ing for in a camp, and offer you a couple of suggestions on camps that would be a good fit for your family.

#### **DECEMBER/JANUARY**

Talk to Friends and Neighbors: It's great to

ask friends where their children go to camp but keep in mind each child is different and while one camp may be good for that child, it might not be the best fit for others. Getting recommenda- tions from friends is a great starting point, but remember to do your own camp research.

Talk to Camp Directors: Parents want to make sure they click with the camp director. Speaking with the camp director and asking some key questions is a good way for families to find out about a camp's philosophy and if it matches your own. Get to know the camp director through phone calls, correspondence, and in person. Make sure to give the camp director an accurate picture of your child and what your specific goals are for your child's camp experience.

Make Camp Part of the Holidays: Instead of purchasing another toy or electronic device for your child, you can make camp a holiday gift.

Prepare Child for Overnights: If you are considering sleep- away camp, schedule sleepovers with friends and relatives and make sure these overnights are successful. If your child felt panicked and needed to come home in the middle of the night, they may not be ready for sleepaway camp.



**Exchange Rate** 

One NYC mom opens her home to a foreign exchange student—and delights in the lessons her family learns

eing from the South, "y'all should come" is usually my immediate response to potential visitors. Even in an undersized Manhattan apartment, I'm almost always happy to have people stay over. That's why, when my elder son's school needed families to put up Spanish exchange students, I didn't think twice about adding a fifth person to a 2-bedroom apartment (already shared by my family of four) for 10 days.

But every now and then, I find myself in a situation where I have to wonder what in the world I was thinking. And that's exactly how I felt when I started prepping for our exchange student Alex's visit—reevaluating everything from logistics and school schedules to language issues, site-seeing demands and my boys' biggest worry—would they get along with the new boy.

Turns out, Nerf guns are a universal icebreaker. Within an hour of meeting, my boys—14-year-old Drew and 12-year-old James- and the Spanish 8th grader had broken into an epic Nerf gun battle and easy rhythm. From the adult perspective, not only was having a 13-year-old exchange student both manageable and enjoyable, it reminded me of my first visit to New York when I was about Alex's age.

Alex, who came to us from an ancient port city in Spain, was lovely—a helpful, chatty, sweatshirt-clad kid with a mop of brown hair who loves paleontology and animals, and said he learned English playing video games.

In preparation for Alex's visit, the boys and I planned all-American dinners—hot dogs and hamburgers, beef stew, shepherd's pie—mixed with sushi and pizza delivery because that's just what New Yorkers do. We supplemented the school's outings with other activities that I ran by his mom. Yes to Coney Island, Central Park, a pinball arcade, Times



Square, and an acrobatic show in Brooklyn. No to museums, a Broadway show, college basketball game, Staten Island Ferry, and a double-decker bus tour.

While having a guest can complicate things, it made me more organized. Rather than sticking my head in the freezer at 4:30pm wondering what would thaw in 30 minutes, dinners were planned and on the table at 6pm sharp—a goal I never accomplish when it's just us. We scheduled weekend activities and got out, rather than letting inertia and homework keep us home. Screen time was actually restricted.

Unfortunately for Alex—but great for me—Drew's homework limited their playtime together so I put Alex to work helping with dinner and the dishes, putting away groceries, straightening up. He learned how to make shepherd's pie, where the recycling room was located and that we did laundry in the basement. Either thanks to great English, nice boy manners, or both, I repeated myself less with Alex than with my native speakers.

Working together gave Alex an opportunity to ask questions: "Why do American women take their husband's last names?" "Why are the strawberries so big?" "What's with the big dinners, and why do we do we eat dinner so early?"

Among his standout new experiences:

A snow day! Being from southern Spain,

this was his first time playing in snow; building a snowman with Drew was a highlight of his trip, his mother said. She said she and her husband had been reluctant to let Alex go so far away but that he convinced them—and it was one of the best things he'd done. He said the tall buildings and yellow taxis were just like in the movies, and the city was alive and unique with everything bigger than at home: food, cars, shops, streets, the park and the city itself. Like me (and every other American new to NYC) when I first saw the Subway, he found transportation overwhelming.

Food featured large in Alex's New York—the different varieties of freshly made sushi, the bakeries with cupcakes, donuts and ice creams sweeter, bigger, tastier and more elaborate than the offerings back home. Also the lack of healthy alternatives and the difficulty in finding salads on the street.

As for my boys, despite early reservations, they realized people can always find common ground. And as for me, I felt we'd accomplished our mission: It didn't take long to turn the kid from Spain into a local, perfectly at home hailing taxis and snapping up California rolls.
